ABOUT VETERANS MATTER'S NATIONAL HOMELESS VETERANS HOUSING PROGRAM



- Veterans matter was started by Ken Leslie, a formerly homeless alcoholic turned CEO in Toledo, Oh to house 35 local veterans.
- It grew after Dusty Hill, John Mellencamp, and Mitch Albom asked Ken to expand it to house the veterans in their home states of Texas, Indiana and Michigan.
- ❖ Then the National Exchange Clubs and regular Americans like you and me stepped up to help ALL veterans get back to a home for the brave in the land of the free!

Over 3,000 veterans, and their families have been housed in 22 states thanks to this partnership!





HOW VETERANS MATTER WORKS



- The VA's Homeless Outreach teams find the homeless veterans and help them find suitable, long-term housing and secure the housing voucher to pay for it. There are government funded, LONG-TERM housing vouchers available to house homeless veterans. But the veterans can't get into that READY housing simply because they don't have the deposit and first month's rent.
- The social workers contact Veterans Matter when they identify veterans in need, who have nowhere else to go, for that deposit.
- Veterans Matter sends the check directly to the landlord the same day.
- Once housed the VA social workers provide extensive wrap around services which give the program a 91% success rate keeping them housed.
- This means every single dollar we deploy results in another veteran housed.







- ❖ We are not trying to recruit anyone to the cause We just want to rally the people who care about the homeless veterans on the streets as much as we do!
- ❖ We want every veteran and veteran organization in the region to unite with us – veterans are counting on us!
