


Keep it simple.

The Travesty

- 38,000: Number of Homeless Veterans in the United States
- 7,057: Number of Service Members
 Killed In the War on Terror
- 30,177: Number of Active Duty and Veterans that have committed suicide
 - Majority of the suicides committed by unhoused Veterans
- A National travesty: to those who pledged their lives to support and defend the freedoms we all enjoy

The Urgency

- 20: Number of Veterans that commit suicide every day!
 - Attacking the Homeless
 Travesty is the best attack
 against suicide



The Opportunity

- The HUD/VASH Program has a 91% success rate in keeping Veterans Housed
- However, Many Homeless
 Veterans do not have the Initial
 Money (first month's rent and
 deposit) to Enter into the
 HUD/VASH Program
- 'Veterans Matter' (a Strategic Partnership of the National Exchange Club) was founded to bridge that funding gap




The Opportunity

The Result

- Over \$170,000 was raised by the Exchange Club of Daniel Island
 - Funds raised from November 2019 –
 December 2021 (25 months)
 - Two Veterans Dinners and extensive engagement and communication in the community (e.g., 17 visible programs, including our Field of Honor with 700 American Flags)



The Result

- Sufficient Funds to get all 119 Homeless Veterans in the Low Country into the HUD/VASH Program!
 - and a great start on housing <u>all</u> Veterans in South Carolina





Why did it work?

Personalized & Localized:

 By Identifying the "real" number of unhoused Veterans in our community, it became personal, a number we could understand and attack.

An Aspirational Goal:

- o 119 Became an aspirational goal for our community
- Community Veterans engaged immediately to contribute for their fellow Veterans in their time of need
- Articles in the local DI Newspaper exposed the challenge to the broader DI Community resulting in visibility to the Travesty and the Opportunity

Directly Contributed to Membership Growth:


Club membership grew by over 10% increasing contributions



The key to the success of **Project Zero** is just that, finding individuals who truly care and want to see homelessness end for those who served us in the most patriotic way.



Identify how many unhoused veterans are in your area (city, county or state) and determine the amount of funds needed to get them into housing.



Contact the local Veterans
Post or Veterans
Administration serving your
area and ask for their input.
They may need to direct
you to another agency to
secure this information.





Contact Veterans Matter to learn about the average housing deposit amount for your area.



Multiply the number of unhoused Veterans times the average deposit amount and you will have your financial goal for **Project Zero.**



If you do not have unhoused veterans in your area, you can elect to raise funds to assist in other cities or states or provide funding to **Veterans Matter** for the next opportunity to house a Veteran.



Plan an event to raise the funds:

- Promote your event
- Local dignitaries or celebrity endorsements
- Plan a "kick-off" or release
- Celebrate your success!




Veterans Matter was started by Ken Leslie, a formerly homeless alcoholic turned CEO in Toledo, Oh to house 35 local veterans. It grew after Dusty Hill, John Mellencamp, and Mitch Albom asked Ken to expand it to house the veterans in their home states of Texas, Indiana and Michigan.

Then **The National Exchange Clubs** and regular Americans like you and me stepped up to help ALL veterans get back to a home for the brave in the land of the free!



Since its inception, nearly 6,000
Veterans and their families, to include almost 2,000 children, have been housed in 28 states thanks, in large part, to our partnership



As leaders in the community, we have the power to change, even save the lives of the unhoused Veterans who have nowhere else to go.

Veterans Matter - How It Works



VA social workers work one-on-one with the Veteran to secure long term housing and the housing voucher.



The social workers contact Veterans Matter to provide the security deposit and first month's rent and the check is sent the same day.



Through their partnership with the VA and HUD-VASH, the program has a 91% success rate in keeping the Veterans housed.
